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## THE SCHOOL

Founded in 1946, Taipei Fuhsing Private School is among the most exclusive private schools in Taipei, Taiwan. We feature a K-12 integrated curriculum, stressing traditional values as well as international perspectives and embodying the best of both Chinese and Western educational philosophies. Fuhsing's goal is and has always been to cultivate future world-class leaders for Taiwan.

In Fuhsing, we provide two different college-preparatory curricula. In the Bilingual Division, our goal is to provide students with the option to focus on preparation for study at international universities. While in the Local Division, students' goal is to continue their higher education in Taiwan.

Because of the well-organized and well-rounded program, Taipei Fuhsing Private School has achieved a high academic reputation in Taiwan. All of our senior high graduates, from both Divisions, have entered either local four-year colleges or universities abroad.

## STUDENT BODY AND SCHOOL STAFF

- Taipei Fuhsing Private School's senior high school-both Divisions-includes grades 10 through 12, with 480 students (194 in the Bilingual Division / 286 in the Local Division).
- Class of 2022: 149 students, including 45 Bilingual Division students and 104 Local Division students.
- There are 94 certified, full-time teachers, teaching in grades 7-12. Average class size is 20-25 students.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

All high-school students must take at least 160 credits to graduate, per Taiwan Ministry of Education requirements, including a minimum of 120 credits of required courses and 40 credits of elective courses. (The Ministry of Education defines a credit as: one 45-minute class period occurring 18 times per semester.)

The school year consists of two semesters. Each semester is about 20 weeks long.

## GRADING SYSTEM

Fuhsing assigns letter grades, using a 4.0 quality-point scale. In the Local Division, we do not offer Honors or AP courses.

In the Bilingual Division, we offer Honors and AP courses in English, math, science and social studies. An additional 0.5 is added for Honors courses. An additional $0.7^{\sim} 1$ point is added for AP courses. Our GPA does not include non-Fuhsing courses.

## CURRICULUM AND PROGRAMS

Taipei Fuhsing Private School provides its students with two different college-preparatory curricula, both rigorous, structured, and demanding.

## Bilingual Division classes:

- Curriculum: In the Bilingual Division, four core courses, English, math, social studies and science, follow the curriculum standards of the US education system, while the other courses follow those of the Taiwan education system. Though the high-school system in Taiwan only includes Grades 10 to 12, all Fuhsing Bilingual Division students start taking US high-school-level courses in Grade 9.
- AP/Honors Courses: To provide students more rigorous and advanced academic learning experience, the Bilingual Division offer AP/Honors courses in English, math, social studies and science for students whose grades meet the requirement.
*The Bilingual Division offers 17 AP courses and 5 Honors courses for class of 2022. The AP courses
include AP English Literature and Composition, AP English Language and Literature, AP Calculus BC, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Physics C: Mechanics, AP Computer Science A, AP Drawing, AP 2D Art and Design, AP 3D Art and Design, AP World History, AP United States History, AP Comparative Government and Politics, AP Human Geography, AP Psychology, AP Macroeconomics, AP Microeconomics.
*A class of 2022 student may take up to 11 AP courses and 5 Honors courses from Grades 10 to 12.
- Featured Courses: We highly value Chinese culture, so all Bilingual Division students must take Chinese Literature and Studies, learn one traditional Chinese musical instrument, Chinese calligraphy, and Chinese painting.
- College Attendance: $100 \%$ of graduates from the Bilingual Division have entered universities abroad.


## Local Division classes:

- Curriculum: The Local Division follows the Grades 7-12 curriculum standards promulgated by the Taiwan Ministry of Education. From Grades 10 to 12, the core courses all students must take are Chinese, math, English, social studies, and science; other courses are music, art, PE, and elective courses.
- Course Difficulty: The Local Division does NOT offer AP/Honors courses; however, the math and science curricula are as rigorous and structured as those of Honors courses in the Bilingual Division. The 3-year math classes include Algebra, Geometry, Statistics, Probability, Functions, Calculus, and Trigonometry. All students need to take 3 science courses (Biology, Chemistry, and Physics) every year.
- Differentiation of Students' Interest: At the beginning of the second semester, all Grade 10 students must decide whether to take Social-Studies Track or Science Track. Those who take SocialStudies Track may take social studies classes for up to 15 periods per week, while students taking Science Track may take science classes up to 17 periods per week.
- Elective Courses: In Grades 10, the Local Division offers a variety of elective courses for students. Each semester, a student must take one elective class in English, and one in Chinese. Each class meets 2 periods per week. Class topics vary every semester and have included Hoard of Mathematical Treasure, Studies in Popular Mathematics, Studies in Social Science, Research in Global Major Issues, Python Programming, Art Design, Study of Spectrum, Biology Research, Story of Me, Ted Talks, etc.
- College Attendance: About 90\% of local students attend universities in Taiwan, and $10 \%$ of students attend universities in Hong Kong, Japan, China and the US.
- Outdoor Education Classes: All Fuhsing students must take outdoor education classes, a distinctive Fuhsing tradition. All outdoor classes are designed to cultivate outstanding future leaders, who are willing to challenge their potentials, to develop problem-solving skills, and to face unexpected difficulties with confidence.
- Co-Curricular Opportunities \& Service: Fuhsing students participate in a wide
 variety of co-curricular activities, including student clubs, musicals, sports, student publications, and regional/national/international competitions. All Grade 10 students must attend a four-day volunteer service in the mountains for the rural elementary school students. Grade $\mathbf{1 1}$ students must climb Hehuan Mountain (Height: 3,417 meters) as a symbolic journey for adulthood.
