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Joe Biden Signs Law to Ban TikTok: What Now?

A month ago on April 24, US President Joe Biden signed a law that would ban the Chinese video streaming app TikTok from the nation unless its sold to another company within a year. The National Security Council stated that Biden signed the bill to address risks to Americans' sensitive data and their broader national security. plus, this is not the first time they've been accused of spying on Americans. The Biden administration and Congress have also mentioned how the Beijing government can demand US user data from ByteDance, the China-based parent company that owns TikTok, under a national security law, and that would allow China to push propaganda through the app's algorithm. That being said, the law is still not expected to cause any immediate disruption to the app, as legal challenges and negotiations on selling the app will likely cause months of delay. Additionally, this law is tied to a bill that would provide foreign aid to Israel, Ukraine, and Taiwan. It makes it more difficult for lawmakers to vote against it as aid to Ukraine has been a key part of Biden's agenda since 2022.

This poses a massive threat to TikTok as the law states that if it's not sold within a year to another company, the law would make it illegal for web-hosting services to support it and force Google and Apple to remove TikTok from app stores. Additionally, this marks the first time the US has passed a law to rig a ban on a social media platform, something condemned in civil liberty groups. This act has also drawn statements of repulsion, as TikTok themselves claimed the law would be 'suppressing the free speech of millions of Americans.' Critics, in response, have stated that 'TikTok is sharing user data with China and yet they're claiming the US is the one suppressing people.'

Selling TikTok would not be simple under Chinese regulations, as any company that decides to purchase the app would have to receive 'blessings' from the Chinese government, and officials in Beijing have resisted forced sales. This would mean that ByteDance would have to sort
